CONSTITUTION

1. The League shall be known as "THE EDINBURGH AND LOTHIAN TABLE TENNIS LEAGUE"
2. The League shall affiliate to the Scottish Table Tennis Association.
3. OBJECT - To promote, develop and control the game of Table Tennis within Edinburgh and Lothians.
4. (a) The Office-bearers shall consist of the President, who will act as Chairman at meetings, Vice-President, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and Honorary Match Secretary, who with at least seven members to be elected at the Annual General Meeting, will constitute the Committee. The Committee shall be elected annually and any retiring member shall be eligible for re-election. No club shall be entitled to have more than three representatives on the Committee.
(b) The Committee shall have power to co-opt members who will not have voting power but who are not subject to the proviso in the final sentence of Paragraph 4(a).
5. The Annual General Meeting shall be held by the 15th May and each club in the League shall be entitled to send one representative for each two teams or part thereof entered in the League. The meeting shall be called by circular to each club and fourteen days' notice of the meeting shall be given. At the Annual General Meeting each representative present shall have one vote.
6. The monies of the League will be deposited with the Royal Bank of Scotland and Trustee Savings Bank. All cheques must be signed by the Honorary Treasurer and counter-signed by one of the undermentioned, namely, the President, the Honorary Secretary or one nominated committee member. The specimen signatures to be lodged with the bank annually by the 15th June.
7. Honoraria, the amount of which shall be determined at the Annual General Meeting shall be paid to such officials of the League as recommended at the A.G.M.
8. A special General Meeting of the League shall be convened on a resolution of the Committee or within fourteen days of receipt by the Secretary of a resolution signed by the authorised representatives of at least one-third of the Clubs in membership of the League, and Paragraph 5 of the Constitution respecting circulation of notices and procedure shall apply as at the Annual General Meeting. Only business detailed on the Agenda, which shall be circulated to all Clubs in League membership, may be discussed at a Special General Meeting. There shall be no "Any other business" item on the Agenda.
9. The Committee shall have powers to decide matters arising in connection with the League. The Committee shall have power to appoint representatives from each Division of the League to meet as necessary during the playing season to discuss the affairs of all the Divisions.
10. Seven shall form a quorum of the League Committee and the Chairman at any meeting shall have a deliberate as well as a casting vote.

RULES

1. The games under the League shall be played according to the rules of the Scottish Table Tennis Association.

All tables in the League must conform to the standard laid down by the Scottish Table Tennis Association regarding size of table and the required bounce of the ball on the playing surface.

The size being 274 centimetres (9ft) length x 152.5 centimetres (5ft) width. The upper surface being 76 centimetres (2ft 6 ins.) above the floor yielding a uniform bounce of not less than 22 centimetres (8.3ins) and not more than 25 centimetres (9.75ins) when a standard ball is dropped from a height of 30.5 centimetres (12 ins).

2. The League shall be open to such Clubs in Edinburgh and Lothians as the Committee may decide. A Club may enter more than one team in the League but each team so entered must pay in advance an Annual Subscription to be determined at the Annual General Meeting of the League, plus such fees as are payable to the Scottish Table Tennis Association.
3. All players must be registered members of the Club for which they play. All players must be registered with the Scottish Table Tennis Association at least 24 hours before playing in any match. Should any team play a non-registered player then all games won by that team, in the match in question, shall be void and will be awarded to the opposing team.
4. No team shall play in any match until all fees have been paid. Any team failing to comply with this rule shall forfeit that match.
5. Except with the permission of the League Committee no player shall play in more than one League, or for more than one Club in the League in the same season.
6. Any Club entering more than one team in the League should register their three strongest players in the first team, their next three strongest players in the second team, and so on in order of playing strength for all teams. The Committee shall have the power to refuse the registration of any player where his playing strength warrants him playing for a higher team. No player shall be allowed to play for a lower team than the one for which he or she is registered, but may play for a higher team having played a TOTAL of six matches with a higher team or teams in League matches other than the one for which he is registered, shall then only be eligible to play for the highest team played for during these matches.

Any player joining a Club after initial registrations have been submitted should be registered for the team most suited to his playing strength.

Any Club wishing to relegate a player or players to a lower team must apply to the Committee to do so.

Any Club wishing to register or re-register a player in a lower team that his/her strength warrants, shall apply to the Committee giving reasons for special consideration. If permission is granted, the said player will only be allowed to play for his/her (re-) registered team, or a team higher than his/her strength warrants.

7. (a) When entries are made to the League a home night for each team will be specified. A fixture list based on this information will be compiled and included in the Handbook.

(b) A copy of the Handbook will be supplied to each player on registration. A fee to cover cost will be charged.

8. (a) A match is played between two sides of three players each, and consists of 9 games (best of three sets), each player playing every opponent. One (1) point will be awarded for a win. Prior to the commencement of each match the names of the players of the Home Team shall be inserted on the Match Score-card by the Captain of the Home Team and thereafter the names of the players of the Away Team shall be inserted by the Captain of the Away Team. The order of play shall be as printed on the Match Score-card.

(b) All matches should start at 7.30 p.m. unless by special agreement. Any player not ready to play within half an hour of the scheduled start of the match may forfeit all games in that match.

(c) The Home Club is responsible for posting the result on the addressed score card to reach the Honorary Match Secretary not later than seven days after the date of the match specified in the Handbook. If the Match Secretary does not receive a result within the above period (except in the event of a postponement having been granted in terms of the immediately succeeding sub-paragraph) the HOME CLUB will be fined, the amount to be fixed at the A.G.M. The fine for season 1979-80 ... 20p. ✓

A team may not postpone a match except with the prior consent of the other team and the Match Secretary, such consents to be obtained not later than three days prior to the scheduled date of the match.

Failure to obtain the agreement of the Match Secretary will result in the offending Club being fined. Fine fixed at the A.G.M. for season 1979-80 ... 50p. ✓ The home team shall notify the Match Secretary of the revised date which must be within fourteen days of the original match date. Exception to this Rule shall only be at the discretion of the Match Secretary. In the event of a revised date not having been agreed upon the match will be awarded against the team requesting the postponement. All complaints and disputes will be made to the Match Secretary. Any team penalised under this rule has a right of appeal to the Committee.

9. Each Club shall pay in advance a deposit of £2, returnable at the end of the Season provided the Club has fulfilled all its fixtures to the satisfaction of the Committee. A serious view will be taken of the non-appearance of a team, when either insufficient or no notice has been given to their opponents. Such offences will be punished by a fine as under:-

First Offence - £1.00, Second Offence - £2, Third Offence - suspension of team from League for remainder of Season.

10.a. Any player playing under an assumed name will be suspended for a period not less than 3 playing months, and the player's club fined a minimum of £10.

- 10.b. Disciplinary action will be taken against any club found guilty of ungentlemanly conduct.
11. A Club having more than one team will require to replace their deposit of £2 within one month, if the previous deposit of £2 has been lost. Failure to comply with this rule will lead to the Club being suspended.
12. No player or Club in membership of the League shall, without the consent of the Committee, participate in any match, exhibition or otherwise which is undertaken by any person or persons for the purpose of financial gain. Likewise, no player or Club in membership of the League shall, without the consent of the Committee, accept any payment for participating in any match either by way of a fee or expense.
13. (a) Each Division of the League will consist of one Section of not more than twelve teams.
- (b) At the end of each season promotion and relegation will be effected as follows:-
- 1st Division: Bottom two teams will be relegated to 2nd Division.
- Other Divisions: Top two teams will be promoted to a higher Division, and the bottom two teams will be relegated to a lower Division.
- In the event of ties, games won and lost will be considered.
14. The Constitution and Rules shall only be capable of being altered, added to, or amended on Notice being given to the League Secretary of any proposed alteration not later than the end of March, which notice shall give in detail any proposed alteration, addition or amendment. A motion to alter, amend or add to the Constitution and Rules must be carried at the Annual General Meeting by a majority of at least two-thirds of those present and voting at the meeting.

COACHING

Weekend coaching courses are run by the S.T.T.A. at Inverclyde Sports Centre, Largs. Details and entry forms for these courses are available from the Scottish Director of Coaching: Mr Eric Sutherland, 8 Whiteshaw Drive, Carluke, Lanarkshire.

In addition to these courses, Meadowbank, Craiglockhart and Jack Kane Sports Centres all run coaching courses, enquiries by telephone.

ADVICE TO SECRETARIES

The League Committee are always willing to be of assistance to your Club. You are requested to make yourself familiar with the Rules, but do not hesitate to seek the advice of a Committee member if you are in doubt on any point.

Always answer correspondence promptly. Make sure that information passed to you by the Committee is replayed to your members quickly.

Ensure that your playing conditions are of an acceptable standard, i.e. replace all faulty light bulbs, spectators seating placed well clear of court etc. Use a new approved ball at the start of every match. Check net height, and have a net measure available.

Your attention is drawn particularly to the rules governing the night that a fixture should be played. Rule 7 and 8. There has been some controversy over the interpretation of Rule 8(b). It is the right of the opposing team to decide whether the latecomer be allowed to play, on his arrival; once the player has completed games the issue will not then be discussed. As a matter of courtesy if you are forewarned one of your players may be late, a telephone call to ascertain whether the opposition will have any objection to this could save frayed temper and bad feeling.

Provide adequate changing facilities for your visitors. Finish the match with refreshments; if, as the visiting team, you do not intend to stay for these refreshments, please inform the home team secretary at least one day in advance.

If there is any change in the details printed in this Handbook, which affect any of your teams, it is your duty to notify, in writing, all the club secretaries in the division concerned. You must also advise the Honorary Match Secretary without delay.

EDINBURGH CUP KNOCK-OUT

HANDICAP COMPETITION

The fee for this competition is 25p per team. If a Club wishes to enter more teams in the cup than in the League, this will be permitted, provided the Handicap Cup Secretary is notified in good time.

The League Rule that players must be registered in playing strength does NOT apply.

Handicaps will be notified to club secretaries as soon as possible. Ties should not be arranged until handicaps are notified.

The Handicap Cup Secretary is - Mr J. Lynn, 24 Duncan Street, Edinburgh, EH9. Telephone 667 0632.

GENERAL RULES

1. Players must be registered in accordance with League Rules.
2. A player may only play for one team throughout the competition.
3. A player not on the handicap list shall play off -12 until the competition Committee can assess his/her standard.
4. The competition Committee may revise handicaps where deemed necessary.
5. Teams shall consist of three players.
6. A match shall consist of 9 best of three set games.
7. The "Home" Team (as defined on draw sheet) shall offer their opponents at least two dates within the allotted period, giving at least four days notice.
8. The visiting team shall be deemed to have defaulted should they not accept one of the dates offered and the match will be awarded to the home side.
9. Players not available for play 30 minutes later than agreed starting time shall forfeit their games.
10. A score card (showing actual scores) should be forwarded, by the WINNING TEAM, to the Handicap Cup Secretary, to arrive not later than 48 hours after the closing date of the respective round.
11. Any dispute shall be submitted, in writing, to the Handicap Cup Secretary to be considered by the Competition Committee whose decision shall be final.
12. MINUS handicaps are added to 21:
(b) PLUS handicaps are within 21 points as follows:-
Plus v Plus: - Deduct one handicap from the other, and play to 21, e.g. +4 plays +12. Play begins at 0 - 8 and is played at 21 points.
Minus v Minus: - Deduct one handicap from the other, and play to 21 plus the difference, e.g. - 12 plays - 4. Play begins at 0 - 8 and is played to 29 points.
Minus v Plus - Add the plus to the minus handicap and play to 21 plus the minus handicap, e.g. - 12 plays + 4. Play begins 0 - 16 and is played to 33 points.
Scoring:- The winner of a game must always score two points more than his opponent, e.g. in a game of 33 up, deuce should be called at 32 all.
13. When a third set is necessary, ends will be changed in the third set when either player has scored half the points necessary for him (or her) to win the set.
e.g. -8 plays +8
+8 plays off 16 to 29 and -8 plays off scratch.
Players will change ends when either
(a) +8 reaches 22 or
(b) -8 reaches 14.
14. In the event of the score going to deuce League Rules will apply.

A. BASIC LAWS OF TABLE TENNIS

1 The Table

The table shall be in surface rectangular, 2.74m in length and 1.525m in width; it shall be supported so that its upper surface, termed the "playing surface", shall lie in a horizontal plane 760mm above the floor. It shall be made of any material and shall yield a uniform bounce of not less than 220mm and not more than 250mm when a standard ball is dropped from a height of 305mm above its surface. The playing surface shall be dark coloured, preferably dark green, and matt, with a white line 20mm broad along each edge. The lines at the 1.525m edges, or ends, shall be termed "end lines", and the lines at the 2.74m edges, or sides, shall be termed "side lines". For doubles, the playing surface shall be divided into halves by a white line 3mm broad, running parallel to the side lines, termed the "centre line". The centre line may, for convenience, be permanently marked in full length on the table and this in no way invalidates the table for singles play.

2 The Net and Its Supports

The playing surface shall be divided into two "courts" of equal size by a net running parallel to the end lines. The net, with its suspension shall be 1.83m in length; along its whole length its upper part shall be 152.5mm above the playing surface and its lower part shall be close to the playing surface. It shall be suspended by a cord attached at each end to an upright post 152.5mm high; the outside limits of each post shall be outside the side line.

3 The Ball

The ball shall be spherical, with a diameter of not less than 37.2mm nor more than 38.2mm. It shall be made of celluloid or similar plastics and shall be white or yellow, and matt. It shall weigh not less than 2.40gm nor more than 2.53gm.

4 The Racket

The racket may be of any size, shape or weight. The blade shall be of wood, of even thickness, flat and rigid. The visible surface of each side of the blade, whether used for striking the ball or not, shall be uniformly dark-coloured and matt; any trimming or binding round the edge of the blade shall not be, either wholly or partly, white or brightly reflecting.

A side of the blade used for striking the ball may be completely uncovered, or covered over the whole of the striking surface with one of the permitted covering materials, each layer of covering being of uniform thickness. An uncovered side of the blade used for striking the ball shall be either naturally dark-coloured or shall be darkened in such a way as not to alter the frictional characteristics of the surface - for example, by staining and not by painting.

The covering material for a side of the blade used for striking the ball may be either ordinary "pimpled rubber," with pimples outwards, having a total thickness including adhesive of not more than 2mm or "sandwich rubber" with pimples inwards or outwards, having a total thickness including adhesive of not more than 4mm. "Pimpled rubber" is a layer of non-cellular rubber, natural or synthetic, with pimples evenly distributed over its surface at a density of not less than 10/sq cm nor more than 50/sq cm. "Sandwich rubber" is a layer of cellular rubber surfaced with a layer of pimpled rubber, the total thickness of the pimpled rubber being not more than 2mm.

The part of the blade nearest the handle and gripped by the fingers may be covered with cork or other material for convenience of grip and is to be regarded as part of the handle. Slight deviations from uniformity or continuity of covering, due to fading, wear or accidental damage, may be ignored provided they do not significantly change the characteristics of the surface. A side of the blade not intended for striking the ball may be painted or covered with any material provided it is uniformly dark-coloured and matt, but if a player strikes the ball in play with a side of the blade which does not conform with the requirements for a striking surface he shall lose a point.

Before using a racket for the first time in a match a player shall, if so requested, show both sides of the blade to his opponent.

5 The Order of Play

In singles, the server shall first make a good service, the receiver shall then make a good return and thereafter server and receiver shall each alternately make a good return.

In doubles, the server shall first make a good service, the receiver shall then make a good return, the partner of the server shall then make a good return, the partner of the receiver shall then make a good return and thereafter each player alternately in that sequence shall make a good return.

6 A Good Service

Service shall begin with the ball resting on the palm of the free hand, which shall be stationary, open and flat, with the fingers together and the thumb free. The free hand, while in contact with the ball in service, shall at all times be above the level of the playing surface.

The server shall then project the ball upwards, by hand only and without imparting spin, so that it rises from the palm of the hand within 45 degrees of the vertical. As the ball is then descending from the height of its trajectory, the server shall strike it so that it touches first his own court and then, passing directly over the net or around or under the projection of the net and its supports outside the table, touches the receiver's court. In doubles, the points of contact of the ball with the playing surface shall be the server's right half-court or centre line and then the receiver's right half-court or centre line. At the moment of impact of the racket on the ball in service, the ball shall be behind the end line of the server's court or an imaginary extension thereof.

It is the responsibility of the player to serve so that the umpire can see that he complies with the requirements of a good service. If the umpire, because his view is obstructed by the server or his partner or for any other reason, has an element of doubt about the correctness of a player's service he may, on the first occasion in a match, interrupt play and warn the player of the appropriate requirement without awarding a point; on any subsequent occasion in the match on which the player's service is of doubtful correctness he shall not be given the benefit of any doubt but shall lose a point. Where, however, there is a clear failure to comply with the requirements of a good service no warning should be given and a point should be awarded against the server.

Exceptionally, strict observance of the prescribed method of service may be waived where the umpire is notified, before play begins, that compliance is prevented by physical disability.

7 A Good Return

The ball, having been served or returned in play, shall be struck so that it passes directly over the net, or around or under the projection of the net and its supports outside the table, and touches the opponent's court; if, however, the ball having been served or returned in play returns with its own impetus over the net it may be struck so that it touches directly the opponent's court. If the ball, in passing over or around the net, touches the net or its supports it shall be considered to have passed directly.

8 In Play

The ball is in play from the last moment at which it is stationary on the palm of the server's free hand before being projected in service until:

- a it has touched one court twice consecutively.
- b it has, except in service, touched each court alternately without having been struck with the racket intermediately.
- c it has been struck by a player more than once consecutively.
- d it has touched a player or anything he wears or carries, except his racket or his racket hand below the wrist.
- e it has been volleyed.
- f it has touched any object other than the net, supports, or those referred to above.
- g it has, in a doubles service, touched the left half-court of the server or of the receiver.
- h it has, in doubles, been struck by a player out of proper sequence, except as provided in Law 15.
- i it has, under the Expedite System, been returned by thirteen successive good returns of the receiving player or pair.

9 A Let

The rally is a let:

- a if the ball served, in passing over or around the net, touch it or its supports, provided their service be otherwise good or be volleyed by the receiver or his partner
- b if a service be delivered when the receiver or his partner is not ready, provided always that a player may not be deemed to be unready if he or his partner attempt to strike at the ball.
- c if, owing to an accident not within his control, a player fail to make a good service or a good return.
- d if it be interrupted for correction of a mistake in playing order or ends.
- e if it be interrupted for application of the Expedite System.
- f if it is interrupted for warning a player for a service of doubtful correctness.

10 A Point

Except as provided in Law 9, a player shall lose a point:

- a if he fail to make a good service.
- b if, a good service or a good return having been made by his opponent, he fail to make a good return.
- c if he, or his racket or anything that he wears or carries, touch the net or its supports while the ball is in play.
- d if he, or his racket, or anything that he wears or carries, move the playing surface while the ball is in play.
- e if his free hand touch the playing surface while the ball is in play.
- f if, before the ball in play shall have passed over the end lines or side lines not yet having touched the playing surface on his side of the net since being struck by his opponent, it come incontact with him or anything he wears or carries.
- g if he volley the ball.
- h if, in doubles, he strike the ball out of proper sequence, except as provided in Law 15.
- i if, under the Expedite System, his service and the twelve following strokes of the serving player or pair be returned by good returns of the receiving player or pair.

11 A Game

A game shall be won by the player or pair first scoring 21 points, unless both players or pairs shall have scored 20 points, when the winner of the game shall be the player or pair first scoring 2 points more than the opposing player or pair.

12 A Match

A match shall consist of one game or the best of three or of five games. Play shall be continuous throughout, except that any player is entitled to claim a rest period of not more than five minutes duration between the third and fourth games of a match and of not more than one minute duration between any other successive games of a match.

13 The Choice of Ends and Service

The choice of ends and the right to serve or receive first in a match shall be decided by toss. The winner of the toss may choose the right to serve or receive first and the loser shall then have the choice of ends and vice versa; the winner of the toss may, if he prefer it, require the loser to make first choice.

In doubles, the pair who have the right to serve the first five services in any game shall decide which partner shall do so. In the first game of a match the opposing pair shall then decide similarly which shall be the first receiver. In subsequent games the serving pair shall choose their first server and the first receiver will then be established automatically to correspond with the first server as provided in Law 14.

14 The Change of Ends and Service

The player or pair who started at one end in a game shall start at the other in the immediately subsequent game and so on, until the end of the match. In the last possible game of the match the players or pairs shall change ends when first either player or pair reaches the score 10.

In singles, after five points, the receiver shall become the server and the server the receiver, and so on until the end of the game or the score 20 - 20, or until the introduction of the Expedite System.

In doubles, the first five services shall be delivered by the selected partner of the pair who have the right to do so and shall be received by the appropriate partner of the opposing pair. The second five services shall be delivered by the receiver of the first five services and received by the partner of the first server. The third five services shall be delivered by the partner of the first server and received by the partner of the first receiver. The fourth five services shall be delivered by the partner of the first receiver and received by the first server. The fifth five services shall be delivered as the first five and so on in sequence until the end of the game or the score 20 - 20, or until the introduction of the Expedite System.

From the score 20 - 20, or if the game is being played under the Expedite System, the sequence of service and receiving shall be the same but each player shall deliver only one service in turn until the end of the game.

The player or pair who served first in a game shall receive first in the immediately subsequent game, and so on until the end of the match. In the last possible game of a doubles match, the receiving pair shall alter its order of receiving when first either pair reaches the score 10.

In each game of a doubles match the initial order of receiving shall be opposite to that in the preceding game.

15 Out or Order of Ends, Serving or Receiving

If by mistake the players have not changed ends when ends should have been changed, they shall change ends as soon as the mistake is discovered, unless a game has been completed since the error, when the error shall be ignored.

If by mistake a player serve or receive out of his turn, play shall be interrupted as soon as the mistake is discovered and shall continue with that player serving or receiving who, according to the sequence established at the beginning of the match, should be server or receiver respectively at the score that has been reached.

In any circumstances, all points scored before the discovery of an error shall be reckoned.

16 Expedite System

If a game be unfinished fifteen minutes after it has begun, the rest of that game and the remaining games of the match shall proceed under the Expedite System. Thereafter, if the service and twelve following strokes of the serving player or pair be returned by good returns of the receiving player or pair, the server shall lose the point. The Expedite System may be introduced at any earlier time, from the beginning of the match up to the end of fifteen minutes of play in any game, at the request of both players or pairs.

17 Definitions and Interpretations

- a The period during which the ball is in play shall be termed a "rally". A rally the result of which is not scored shall be termed a "let", and a rally the result of which is scored shall be termed a "point".
- b The player who first strikes the ball during a rally shall be termed the "server", and the player who next strikes the ball shall be termed the "receiver".
- c The "racket hand" is the hand carrying the racket, and the "free hand" is the hand not carrying the racket.
- d "Struck" means "hit with the racket, carried in the racket hand, or with the racket hand below the wrist". A stroke made with the hand alone, after dropping the racket, or by the racket after it has slipped or been thrown from the hand, is "not good".
- e If the ball in play comes into contact with the racket held in racket hand or the racket hand below the wrist, not yet having touched the playing surface on one side of the net since last being struck on the other side, it shall be said to have been "volleyed".
- f The "playing surface" shall be regarded as including the top edges of the table, and a ball in play which strikes these latter is, therefore "good" and still in play; if it strikes the side of the table-top below the edge it becomes out of play and counts against the last striker (see diagram on p. 14).

g "Around the net" means under or around the projection of the net and its supports outside the table, but not between the end of the net and the post (see diagram on p. 14).

h If a player, in attempting to serve, misses the ball altogether he loses a point, because the ball is in play from the moment it is deliberately projected from the hand.

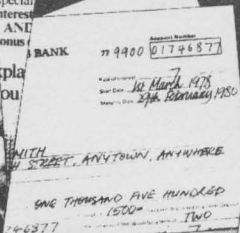

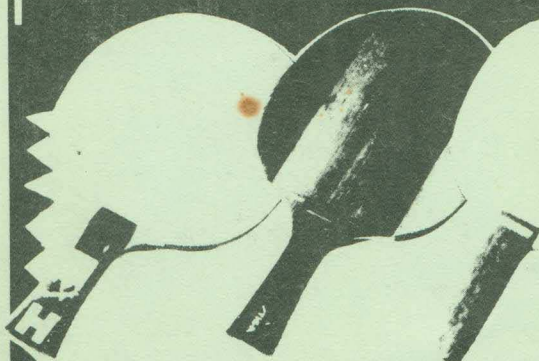
