

ADVICE TO SECRETARIES :::

The League Committee is always willing to be of assistance to your Club. You are requested to make yourself familiar with the Rules, but do not hesitate to seek advice of the Committee Member if you are in doubt on any point.

Always answer correspondence promptly. Make sure the information passed on to you by the Committee is relayed to your Members.

Ensure that your Playing Conditions are of an acceptable standard, e.g. replace faulty lamps; spectators seating placed well clear of the Playing Area, etc., etc.. Use a new Approved Ball at the start of every Match. Check Net Height, have a Net Measure available.

Your attention is drawn particularly to the Rules governing the Night the Fixture should be played, (Rules 7 & 8). There has been some contraversy over Rule 8(B). It is the right of the Opposing Team to decide whether Latecomers be allowed to Play, on his Arrival; once the Player has completed games, the issue will not be discussed. As a matter of Courtesy, if you are forewarned one of your Players may be late, a Telephone Call to ascertain whether the Opposition will have any objections to this could save frayed temper and bad feeling.


Provide adequate Changing facilities for your Visitors. Finish the Match with refreshments; if, as the Visiting Team you do not intend staying for these Refreshments, please inform the Home Secretary at least a day in advance.

It is anticipated that Club Officials will advise their Members of their Mode of Behaviour during a Match.

If there is any change in the details in this handbook which effect any of your team, it is your duty to notify, in writing, all the Club Secretaries in the Division concerned. You must also advise the Match Secretary without delay.

The Fee for this Competition shall be 50p per team. If a Club wishes to enter more teams in the Cup than in the League, this will be permitted, provided the Handicap Cup Secretary is notified in good time.

The League Rule that Players must be registered in Playing Strength Order does not apply.

Handicaps will be notified to Club Secretaries as soon as possible. Ties should not be arranged until Handicaps are notified.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Players must be Registered in accordance with League Rules.
- 2. A Player may only play for one Team throughout the Competition.
- 3. A Player on the Handicap List shall play -12 until the Competition Committee can assess his/her standard.
- 4. The Competition Committee may revise Handicaps where deemed necessary.
- 5. Teams shall consist of 3 Players.
- 6. A Match shall consist of 9 Best of Three Set games.
- 7. The 'Home' Team (as defined on Draw Sheet), shall offer their Opponents at least two dates within the allotted period, giving at least four days notice.
- 8. The Visiting Team shall be deemed to have defaulted should they not accept one of the dates offered, and the Match shall be awarded to the Home Side.
- 9. Players not available for play 30 minutes later than agreed Starting Time shall forfeit their Games.
- 10 A Scorecard (showing actual Scores) should be forwarded by the Winning Team to the handicap Cup Secretary, to arrive not later than 48 hours after the closing date of the respective Round.
- 11 Any Dispute shall be submitted, in writing, to the Handicap Cup Secretary, to be considered by the Competition Committee whose decision shall be final.

HANDICAP COMPETITION

GENERAL RULES (cont)

- 12 MINUS Handicaps are added to 21.
 PLUS Handicaps are within 21 points as follows :-
 - PLUS v PLUS Deduct one handicap from the other and play to 21. e.g. A +4 plays a +12 play begins at 0-8 and is played to 21 points.
 - MINUSvMINUS Deduct one Handicap from the other and play to 21plus the difference. e.g. -12 plays -4 play begins at 0-8 and is played to 29 points.
 - MINUS v PLUS- Add the Plus to the Minus handicap and play to 21 plus the Minus handicap. e.g. -12 plays +4 play begins at 0-16 and is played to 33 points.
 - SCORING The Winner of a game must always score two points more than his/her opponent. e.g. in a game of 33 up deuce shall be called at 32 all.
- 13 When a third Set is Necessary, ends will be changed in the third Set when either Player has scored half the Points necessary for him/her to win the set. e.g. +8 plays -8 +8 plays off 16 to 29 and -8 plays off scratch. Players will change ends when either -
 - (a) +8 reaches 22
 - (b) -8 reaches 14.
- 14 In the event of the Score going to Deuce, League Rules shall apply.

CONSTITUTION

- $\frac{1}{2}$ The League shall be known as "THE EDINBURGH & LOTHIANS TABLE TENNIS LEAGUE".
- $\underline{2}$ The League shall affiliate to THE SCOTTISH TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION
- $\underline{3}$ OBJECT to promote, develop, and control, the Game of Table Tennis within Edinburgh and the Lothians.
- 4 (a) The Office-Bearers shall consist of the President, (who will act as Chairman at Meetings); Vice-President; Honorary Secretary; Honorary Treasurer; and Honorary Match Secretary, who with at least SEVEN Members to be elected at the Annual General Meeting, will constitute the Committee. The Committee shall be elected annually and any retiring Member shall be eligible for re-election. No Club shall be entitled to have more than three representatives on the Committee.
 - (b) The Committee shall have power to co-opt members who will not have Voting power but who are not subject to the proviso in the final sentence of Paragraph 4(a).
- 5 The Annual General Meeting shall be held by the 15th May, and each Club in the League shall be entitled to send one representative for each two Teams, or part thereof, entered in the League. The Meeting shall be called by Circular to each Club, together with Motions to be discussed, and fourteen days notice of the Meeting shall be given. At the Annual General Meeting each representative shall have one Vote.
- 6 The monies of the League will be deposited with the Royal Bank of Scotland and Trustee Savings Bank. All cheques must be signed by the Honorary Treasurer and countersigned by one of the undermentioned, namely, the President; the Honorary Secretary; or one nominated Committee member. The specimen signatures to be lodged with the bank annually by the 15th June.
- 7 Honorarias, the amount of which shall be determined at the Annual General Meeting, shall be paid to such Officials of the League as recommended at the Annual general Meeting.
- 8 A Special General Meeting of the League shall be convened on a Resolution of the Committee, or within fourteen days of receipt by the Secretary of a Resolution signed by the authorised representatives of at least one-third of the Clubs in membership of the league, and Paragraph 5 of the Constitution respecting circulation of Notices and Procedure shall apply as at the Annual General Meeting.

CONSTITUTION (cont.)

- 8. (cont.) Only Business detailed on the Agenda, which shall be circulated to all Clubs in League membership, may be discussed at a Special General Meeting. There shall be no 'Any other Business' item on the Agenda.
- 9. The Committee shall have powers to decide matters arising in connection with the League. The Committee shall have power to appoint representatives from each Division of the League to meet as necessary during the Playing Season to discuss the affairs of all the Divisions.
- 10. Seven shall form a Quorum of the League Committee, and the Chairman at any meeting shall have a deliberate as well as a casting Vote.
- 11. The Constitution and Rules shall only be capable of being altered, added to, or amended, on notice being given to the League Secretary of any proposed alteration, not later than the end of March, which notice shall give in detail any proposed, alteration, addition, or amendment. A Motion to alter, amend, or add, to the Constitution and Rules must be carried at the Annual General Meeting by a majority of at least two-thirds of these present and voting at the Meeting.

RULES

- 1. The games under the League shall be played according to the Rules of the Scottish Table Tennis Association.
 - All tables in the League must conform to the standard laid down by the Scottish Table Tennis Association regarding size of table and the required bounce of the ball on the playing surface.
 - The size being 274cm (9ft) length x 152.5cm (5ft) width. The upper surface being 76cm (2ft 6in) above the floor, yielding a uniform bounce of not less than 22cm (8.3in), and not more than 25cm (9.75in) when a standard ball is dropped from the height of 30.5cm (12in).
- 2. The League shall be open to such Clubs in Edinburgh and the Lothians as the Committee may decide. A'Club may enter more than one Team in the League, but each Team so entered must pay in advance an Annual Subscription to be determined at the Annual General Meeting of the League, plus such Fees as are payable to the Scottish Table Tennis Association.
- 3. All Players must be Registered Members of the Club for which they play. All Players must be Registered with the Scottish Table Tennis Association at least 24 hours before playing in any match. Should any Team play a non-Registered Player then all Games won by that Team, in the Match in question, shall be void and will be awarded to the opposing Team.
- 4. No Team shall play in any Match until all Fees have been paid. Any Team failing to comply with this Rule shall forfeit all Matches from the start of their Season until all Fees are paid.
- 5. Except with the permission of the League Committee, no Player shall play in more than one League, or for more than one Club in the League in the same Season.
- 6. Any Club entering more than one Team in the League should Register their three strongest Players in the First Team, their next three strongest in the Second Team, and so on, in order of Playing Strength for all Teams. The Committee shall have the power to refuse the Registration of any Player where his/her Playing Strength warrants his/her playing for a Higher Team. No Player shall be allowed to play for a Lower Team than the one for which he/she is registered.

 Any Player having played a TOTAL of six Matches with a Higher Team or Teams in League Matches, other than the one for which he/she is Registered, he/she shall then only be eligible to play for the Highest Team played for during these Matches. If a Player subsequently plays in a Higher Team than the one he/she became committed to, the Player will automatically become Registered for the Higher Team only. Any Player joining a Club after initial Registrations have been submitted, should be Registered for the Team most suitable to his/her Playing Strength.

Any Club wishing to Relegate a Player or Players to a Lower Team must apply to the Committee to do so.

Any Club wishing to Register or Re-Register a Player in a Lower Team than his/her strength warrants shall apply to the Committee, giving reasons for special consideration. If permission is granted, the said player will only be allowed to play for his/her Re-Registered Team.

There is no need for Clubs to apply to the Co. ittee for the Re-Registering of a Player - UP.

- (a) When entries are made to the League, a Home Night for each Team will be specified. A Fixture List based on this information will be compiled and included in the Handbook.
 - (b) A copy of the Handbook will be supplied to each Player on Registration
 a Fee to cover will be charged.
 - (c) All Teams must start the Season according to the Handbook, unless otherwise agreed by the Committee.
- 8. (a) A Match is played between two Sides of three Players each, and consists of 9 Games (best of 3 sets), each Player playing every Opponent. One (1) point will be awarded for a Win. Prior to the commencement of each Match, the Names of the Players of the Home Team shall be inserted in the Match Scorecard by the Captain of the Home Team, and thereafter the Names of the Players of the Away Team shall be inserted by the Captain of the Away Team. The Order of Play shall be printed on the Scorecard.
 - (b) All Matches should start at 7.30pm, unless by special agreement.
 Any Player not ready to Play within half-an-hour of the scheduled
 Start of the Match may forfeit all Games in that Match.
 - (c) No Player may Play for more than one Team on the same evening.
 - (d) The Home Club is responsible for posting the Result on an Addressed Scorecard, to reach the Honorary Match Secretary not later than seven days after the Date of the Match specified in the Handbook. If the Match Secretary does not receive a Result within the above period, (except in the event of a postponement having been granted in terms of the immediately succeeding sub-paragraph), the Home Club will be Fined, the amount to be fixed at the AGM. The Fine for Season 1987-88 = 50p.

A Team may not Postpone a Match except with the prior consent of the Other Team and the Match Secretary, such Consents to be obtained not later than three days prior to the Scheduled Date of the Match. Failure to obtain the agreement of the Match Secretary will result in the Offending Club being Fined. Fine fixed at AGM for Season 1987-88 = £2. The Home Team shall notify the Match Secretary of the Revised Date, which must be within fourteen days of the Original Match date. Exception to this Rule shall only be at the discretion of the Match Secretary. In the event of the Revised Date not having been agreed upon, the Match will be awarded against the Team requesting the postponement. All Complaints and Disputes will be made to the Match Secretary. Any Team penalised under this Rule has a right to Appeal to the Committee.

9. Each Club shall pay in advance a Deposit of £10, returnable at the end of the Season, provided the Club has fulfilled all its Fixtures to the satisfaction of the Committee. A serious view will be taken of the Non-Appearance of a Team, when either insufficient or no Notice has been given to their Opponents, or when a Match is Conceded without Reasons acceptable to the Committee. Such Offences shall be punished by Fines as under:—

First Offence = £5; Second Offence = £8; Third Offence = £20 and have a suspension of the Team from the League for the remainder of the Season. The Committed Players of Team which is Suspended will also be Suspended, the Team will automatically be Relegated to the Bottom Division for the following Season, subject to an Appeal to the Committee.

- 10. (a) Any Player playing under an Assumed Name will be Suspended, along with his/her Team Members on that Occasion, for a period not less than three Playing Months, and the Player's Club fined a Minimum of 10.
 - (b) Disciplinary Action will be taken against any Club and/or Individual found guilty of ungentlemanly conduct.
- A Club having more than one Team will require to Replace their Deposit of flo within one month, if the previous Deposit of flo has been lost. Failure to comply with this Rule will lead to the Club being Suspended.
- No Player or Club in Membership of the League shall, without the consent of the Committee, participate in any Match, Exhibition, or otherwise, which is undertaken b, any person or persons for the purpose of Financial Gain. Like ise, no Player or Club in Membership of the League shall, without the consent of the Committee, accept any Payment for participating in any Match, either by way of a Fee or Expenses.
- 13. (a) Each Division of the League will consist of one Section of not more than Twelve Teams.
 - (b) At the end of each Season Promotion and Relegation will be affected as follows:-

1st Division: Bottom two Teams will be Relegated to 2nd Division.

Other Divisions: Top two Teams will be Promoted to a Higher Division, and Bottom two Teams will be Relegated to a Lower Division.

In the event of Ties, Individual Matches will be considered, if a Tie still results a Play-Off will be held on Neutral Premises.

THE LAWS OF TABLE TENNIS :::

1. THE TABLE :

- (1) The upper surface of the table known as the "playing surface" shall be rectangular 2.74m long and 1.525m wide, and shall lie in a horizontal plane 76cm above the floor.
- (2) The playing surface shall include the top edges of the table but not the sides of the table top below the edges.
- (3) The playing surface may be of any material and shall yield a uniform bounce of about 23cm when a standard ball is dropped on it from a height of 30cm.
- (4) The playing surface shall be uniformly dark coloured and matt with a white line 2cm wide along each edge.
 - (The lines along the 2.74m edges shall be known as "side lines") (The lines along the 1.525m edges shall be known as "end lines".
- (5) The playing surface shall be divided into two equal "courts" by a vertical net running parallel with the end lines, and shall be continuous over the whole area of each court.
- (6) (For Doubles) : (Each court shall be divided into two equal "half courts" by a white line 3mm wide, known as the "centre line" running parallel with the side lines.) (The centre line shall be regarded as part of the server's right half court of the receiver's right half court.)

2. THE NET ASSEMBLY :::

- (1) The net assembly shall consist of the net, its sum ension and the supporting posts.
- (2) The net shall be suspended by a cord attached at each end to an upright post 15.25cm high, the outside limits of the post being 15.25cm outside the side line.
- (3) The top of the net, along its whole length, shall be 15.25cm above the playing surface.
- (4) The bottom of the net, along its whole length, shall be as close as possible to the playing surface and the ends of the net shall be as close as possible to the supporting posts.

THE BALL :::

- (1) The ball shall be spherical with a diameter of 38mm.
- (2) The ball shall weigh 2.5gm.
- (3) The ball shall be made of celluloid or similar plast cs material and shall be white or yellow, and matt.

4. THE RACKET :::

(1) The racket may be of any size, shape, or weight, but the blade shall be flat and rigid, and shall be made of wood. (At least 85% of the blade thickness shall be of natural wood).

(An adhesive layer within the blade may be reinforced with fibrous material such as

carbon fibre, glass fibre, or compressed paper, but shall not be thicker than 7.5% of the total thickness, or 0.35mm, whichever is the smaller).

(2) A side of the blade used for striking the ball shall be covered with either ordinary pimpled rubber, with pimples outwards having a total thickness, including adhesive, of not more than 2mm, or sandwich rubber with pimples inwards or outwards having a total thickness, including adhesive, of not more than 4mm. ("Ordinary pimpled rubber" is a single layer on non-cellular rubber, natural or

synthetic, with pimples evenly distributed over its surface ar a density of not less than 10/sq cm, and not more than 50/sq cm).

("Sandwich rubber" is a single layer of cellular rubber covered with a single outer layer of ordinary pimpled rubber, the thickness of the pimpled rubber not being more

than 2mm).

- (3) The covering material shall extend up to but not beyond the limits of the blade, except that the part nearest the handle and gripped by the fingers may be left uncovered or covered with any material and may be considered part of the handle.
- (4) The blade, any layer within the blade, and any layer of covering material, or adhesive, shall be continuous and of even thickness.
- (5) The surface of the covering material on a side of the blade, or of a side of the blade, if it is left uncovered, shall be uniformly dark-coloured and matt, any trimming round the edge of the blade shall be matt, and no part of it shall be white.

- 4. THE RACKET (cont.) :::
- (6) Slight deviations from continuity of surface or uniformity of colour due to accidental damage, wear, or fading, may be allowed, provided that they do not significantly change the characteristics of the surface.
- (7) At the start of a match, and whenever he changes his racket during a match, a player shall show his opponent and the umpire the racket he is about to use and shall allow them to examine it.
- N.B.From 1st January 1984, in World, Continental, and Open International Championships, the surfaces of the two sides of the racket, whether used for striking the ball or not, and whether the two surfaces are the same or not, are to be of clearly different colours.

5. DEFINITIONS :::

- (1) A "rally" is the period during which the ball is in play.
- (2) A "let" is a rally of which the result is not scored.
- (3) A "point" is a rally of which the result is scored.
- (4) The "racket hand" is the hand carrying the racket.
- (5) The "free hand" is the hand not carrying the racket.
- (6) A player "strikes" the ball if he touches it with his racket, held in the hand, or with his racket hand below the wrist.
- (7) A player "volleys" the ball if he strikes it in play when it has not touched his court since last being struck by his opponent.
- (8) A player "obstructs" the ball if he, or anything he wears or carries, touches it in play when it has not passed over his court or an imaginary extension of his end line, not having touched his court since last being struck by his opponent.
- (9) The "server" is the player due to strike the ball first in a rally.
- (10) The "receiver" is the player due to strike the ball second in a rally.
- (11) The "umpire" is the person appointed to decide the result of each rally.
- (12) Anything that a player "wears or carries" includes anything that he was wearing or carrying at the start of the rally.
- (13) The ball shall be regarded as passing "over or around" the net if it passes under or outside the projection of the net assembly outside the table, or if in a return, it is struck after it has bounced back over the net.

6. A GOOD SERVICE :::

- (1) Service shall begin with the ball resting on the palm of the free hand which shall be stationary, open, and flat, with the fingers together and the thumb free.
- (2) The free hand and the racket shall be above the level of the playing surface from the last moment at which the ball is stationary on the palm of the free hand until the ball is struck in service.
- (3) The whole of the racket shall be above the level of the playing surface from the last moment at which the ball is stationary on the palm of the free hand until the ball is struck in service.
- (4) The server shall then project the ball by hand only and without imparting spin, so that it rises at least 16cm after leaving the palm of the free hand.
- (5) As the ball is falling from the highest point of its trajectory the server shall strike it so that -
 - (In singles it touches first his court and then, passing directly over or around the net assembly, touches the receiver's court.)
 - (In doubles it touches first his right half-court and then passing directly over or around the net assembly, touches the receiver's right half-court.)
- (6) When the ball is struck in service, it shall be behind the end line of the server's court, or an imaginary extension thereof, but not further back than the part of the server's body other than his arm head on long which is the footback from the net
- server's body, other than his arm, head, or leg, which is the farthest from the net.

 (7) It is the responsibility of the player to serve so that the umpire or assistant umpire can see the he complies with the requirements for a good service.
 - (Except when an assistant umpire has been appointed, the umpire may, on the first occasion in a match at which he has a doubt about the correctness of a player's service, interrupt play and warn the server without awarding a point.)
 - (On any subsequent occasion in the same match at which the same player's service action is of doubtful correctness, for the same or for any other reason, the player shall not be given the benefit of the doubt and shall lose a point.)

- 6. A GOOD SERVICE (cont.) :::
- (7) (Whenever there is a clear failure by the server to comply with the requirements for a good service, no warning shall be given and he shall lose a point, on the first as on any other occasion.)
- (8) Exceptionally strict observance of any particular requirement for a good service may be waived where the umpire is notified, before play begins, that compliance with that requirement is prevented by physical disability.
- 7. A GOOD RETURN :::
- (1) The ball having been served or returned shall be struck so that it passes over or around the net assembly and touches the opponent's court iether directly or after touching the net assembly.
- 8. THE ORDER OF PLAY :::
- (1) In singles the server shall first make a good service, the receiver shall then make a good return, and thereafter server and receiver alternately shall each make a good return.
- (2) In doubles the server shall first make a good service the receiver shall then make a good return, the partner of the server shall then make a good return, the partner of the receiver shall then make a good return, and thereafter each player in turn in that sequence shall make a good return.
- 9. IN PLAY :::
- (1) The ball shall be in play from the last moment at which it is stationary before being projected in service until -
 - (It touches anything other than the playing surface, the net assembly, the racket held in the hand, or the racket hand below the wrist)— or (The rally is otherwise decided as a let or a point).
- 10. A LET :::
 - (1) The rally shall be a let -
 - (If in service the ball in passing over or around the net assembly touches it, provided the service is otherwise good or is volleyed or obstructed by the receiver or his partner.)
 - (If the service is delivered when, in the opinion of the umpire, the receiving player or pair is nor ready, provided that neither the receiver nor his partner attempts to strike the ball.)
 - (If, in the opinion of the umpire, failure to make a good service or a good return or otherwise to comply with the Laws is due to a dis rbance outside the control of the player.)
 - (If it is interrupted to correct an error in the order of servicing, receiving, or ends.)
 - (If it is interrupted to introduce the expedite system.)
 - (If it is interrupted to warn a player that his service is of doubtful correctness.)
 - (If the conditions of play, which in the opinion of the umpire, is likely to effect the outcome of the rally.)
- 11. A POINT :::
 - (1) Unless the rally is a let, a player shall lose a point -
 - (If he fails to make a good service.)
 - (If he fails to make a good return,)
 - (If he volleys or obstructs the ball, excepted as provided in 10.1.)
 - (If he strikes the ball twice successively.)
 - (If the ball touches his court twice successively.)
 - (If he strikes the ball with a side of the racket blade whose surface does not comply with the requirements of 4.2.)
 - (If he, or anything he wears or carries moves the playing surface while the ball is in play.)
 - (If his free hand touches the playing surface while the ball is in play.)
 - (If he or anything he wears or carries touches the net or its supports while the ball is in play.)
 - (If when he is serving he or his partnet stamps his foot.)
 - (If in doubles he strikes the ball out of the sequence established by the server and receiver.)
 - (If under the expedite system he serves and the receiving player or pair makes thirteen successive good returns.)

12. A GAME :::

A game shall be one by a player or pair first scoring 21 points, unless both players or pairs score 20 points, the game shall be won by the player or pair first scoring subsequently 2 points more than the opposing player or pair.

13. A MATCH :::

A match shall consist of the best of 3 games or the best of 5 games. (Play shall be continuous throughout a match, except that any player shall be entitled to claim an interval of not more than two minutes between successive games.)

14. THE CHOICE OF SERVING, RECEIVING, AND ENDS :::

(1) The right to serve or receive first or to choose an end shall be decided by lot.

(2) The winner may -

(Choose to serve or to receive first when the loser shall have the choice of ends), (Choose an end when the loser shall have the choice of serving or receiving first),

(Require the loser to make the first choice when the winner shall have whichever choice is not made by the loser).

(3) In doubles the pair having the right to serve first in any game shall decide which of them will do so.

(In the first game of the match the opposing pair shall then decide which of them will receive first).

(In subsequent games of the match the first receiver will be determined by the choice of server, in accordance with the requirements of 15.5).

15. THE ORDER OF SERVING, RECEIVING, AND ENDS :::

(1) After 5 ponts have been scored the receiving player or pair shall become the serving player or pair, and so on until the end of the game, or until each player or pair has scored 20 points, or until the introduction of the expedite system.

(2) In doubles -

(The first server shall be the selected player of the pair having the right to serve first and the first receiver shall be the appropriate player of the opposing pair.) (The second server shall be the player who was the first receiver and the second receiver shall be the partner of the first server.)

The third server shall be the partner of the first server and the third receiver shall be the partner of the first receiver.)

The fourth server shall be the partner of the first receiver and the fourth receiver shall be the first server.)

(The fifth server shall be the player who was the first server and the players shall thereafter serve in the same sequence until the end of the game.)

(3) If both players or pairs have scored 20 points or if the expedite system is in operation the sequence of serving and receiving shall be the same but each player shall serve for only one point in turn until the end of the game.

(4) The player or pair who served first in a game shall receive first in the immediate subsequent game of the match.

(5) In each game of doubles match after the first, the first server having been chosen the first receiver shall be the player who served to him in the immediately preceeding

(6) In the last possible game of a doubles match the pair due next to receive shall change the order of receiving when first either paid scores 10 points.

(7) The player or pair starting at one end in a game shall start at the other end in the immediately subsequent game of the match.

(8) In the last possible game of a match the players shall change ends when first either player or pair scores 10 points.

16. OUT OF ORDER SERVING, RECEIVING, AND ENDS :::

(1) If the players have not changed ends when they should have done so, play shall be interrupted as soon as the error is discovered and shall resume with the players at the ends which they should be at the score that has been reached, according to the sequence established at the beginning of the match.

(2) If a player serves or receives out of turn play shall be interrupted as soon as the error is discovered and shall resume with those players serving and receiving who should be server and receiver respectively at the score that has been reached, according to the sequence established at the beginning of the match, and, in doubles, to the order of serving chosen by the pair having the right to serve first in the game during which the error is discovered.

- 16. OUT OF ORDER SERVING, RECEIVING, AND ENDS (cont.) :::
- (3) In any circumstances, all points scored before the discovery of an error shall be reckoned.
- 17. THE EXPEDITE SYSTEM :::
- (1) The expedite system shall come into operation if a game is unfinished after 15 minutes play, or at any earlier time at the request of both players or pairs.
 (If the ball is in play when the time limit is reached, play shall resume with service by the player who served in the rally that was interrupted.)
 (If the ball is not in play when the time limit is reached, play shall resume with service by the player who received in the immediately preceding rally of the game.)
- (2) Thereafter each player shall serve for one point in turn, in accordance with 15.3, and if rally is not decided before the receiving player or pair makes thirteen good returns the server shall lose the point.
- (3) Once introduced, the expedite system shall remain in operation for the remainder of the match.




