Advice To Club Secretaries

The League Committee is always willing to be of assistance to your club. You are requested to make yourself familiar with the rules, but do not hesitate to seek advice of the committee members if you are in doubt on any point. Always answer correspondence promptly and make sure written matter of interest to your members is brought to their attention.

Ensure that your playing conditions are of an acceptable standard; e.g. replace faulty light bulbs, arrange spectator seating well clear of the playing area, use a **new approved ball** at the start of every match (see Rule 1), check net height and have a **net measure** available. Your attention is drawn in particular to the rules governing the night the fixture should be played (Rules 7&8). There has been controversy over Rule 8b. It is the right of the opposing team to decide whether latecomers be allowed to play on arrival - once the player has completed games the issue will not be discussed. As a matter of courtesy if you are forewarned one of your players may be late, a telephone call to ascertain whether the opposition will have any objections to this, could prevent frayed tempers and bad feeling.

Provide adequate changing facilities for your visitors.

Finish the match with refreshments. If, as the visiting team, you do not intend staying for refreshments, please advise the home club's secretary at least a day before the fixture. It is expected that club officials will advise their members of their mode of conduct during a match.

Consult with the match secretary as well as the opposition in respect of postponing a match. Ensure the scorecard is posted off in plenty time, otherwise a fine is involved.

Please note Scorecards for the handicap cup do not go to the match secretary (John Glen), but to the Handicap Cup secretary (Ian Robertson).

The appropriate fee must be forwarded when registering new additional players once the playing season is underway. All fees and fines must be paid at the secretaries' meeting or before.

Encourage your players to participate in tournaments. Details of local and nationwide tournaments can be found on the STTA website. (www.tabletennisscotland.com)

Handicap Cup

The Handicap Cup secretary: Ian Robertson,94 South Gyle Mains, Edinburgh, EH12 9EP Tel (0131) 539 1402 (H)

If a club wishes to enter more teams in the cup than in the league this will be permitted provided the handicap cup secretary is notified in good time. The rule that players must be registered in playing strength order does not apply. Handicaps will be notified to the club secretary as soon as possible. Ties shall not be arranged until handicaps are notified.

The handicap secretary should be informed as soon as possible if anyone, other than the Club Secretary, has been delegated the responsibility for the arrangement of the cup matches.

- Players must be registered in accordance with league rules.
- 2. A player may only play for one team throughout the competition.
- 3. A new player on the handicap list shall play off -12 until the committee can assess his/her strength.
- 4. The committee shall revise handicaps when deemed necessary.
- 5. Teams shall consist of 3 players with a maximum of 5 players being allowed to play for a team.
- 6. A match shall consist of 9 (best of 3 set) games.
- 7. For all rounds, except the semi-finals and final, the home team (as defined on the draw sheet) shall offer their opponents at least 2 dates within the allotted period, giving at least 4 days notice. Teams which are unable to offer more than one date in the scheduled week of the competition will be required to forfeit home advantage. If the other team has the same problem, the date and venue will be decided by the handicap cup secretary
- 8. The visiting team shall be deemed to have defaulted the match should they not accept one of the dates offered and the match shall be awarded to the home side.
- 9. The *semi-finals* will be played during the first week after the end of the normal season, at neutral venues or as mutually agreed.

The *final* will be played during the second week after the scheduled end of the normal season. The final will be played on the Monday evening at Murrayfield, or at an alternative venue and date as mutually agreed, during that week.

- 10. Players not available to play 30 minutes later than agreed starting time shall forfeit their games.
- 11. A scorecard (showing actual scores) shall be forwarded by the winning team to the Handicap Cup secretary to arrive not later than 48 hours after the closing date of the respective round.
- 12. Any dispute shall be submitted (in writing) to the Handicap Cup secretary to be considered by the competition committee whose decision shall be final.
- 13. Minus handicaps are added to 21.

Plus handicaps are within 21 points as follows:

Plus v Plus: deduct one handicap from the other and play to 21 (e.g. If +4 plays +12, play begins at 0 - 8 and is played to 21).

Minus v Minus: deduct one handicap from the other and play to 21 plus difference.

(e.g. If -4 plays -12, play begins at 0 - 8 and is played to 29)

Minus v Plus: add the plus to the minus handicap and play to 21 plus the minus handicap

(e.g. If +4 plays -12, play begins at 0 - 16 and is played to 33)

Scoring: the winner of a game must always score 2 points more than their opponent.

(e.g. In a game of 33 up, deuce shall be called at 32 all.)

14. When a third set is necessary, ends will be changed when either player has scored half the points necessary to win the set.

(e.g. If +8 plays -8, +8 plays off 16 to 29 and -8 plays off scratch.

Players will change ends when either: +8 reaches 22 or -8 reaches 14.)

Constitution

- 1. The league shall be known as the "Edinburgh & Lothians Table Tennis League".
- 2. The League shall affiliate to the Scottish Table Tennis Association.
- 3. Object: to promote, develop, and control, the game of table tennis within the city of Edinburgh and the Lothians.
- 4. (a) The Office-Bearers shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Honorary Secretary/Treasurer, Honorary Match Secretary, whom with at least 7 Members to be elected at the Annual General Meeting will constitute the Committee. The Committee shall be elected annually and any retiring Member shall be eligible for re-election. No Club shall be entitled to have more than 3 representatives on the Committee.
 - (b) The Committee shall have power to co-opt members who will not have Voting Power but who are not subject to the proviso in the final sentence of paragraph 4(a).
 - (c) The Committee shall elect a Chairman at its first meeting following the Annual General Meeting.
- 5. The Annual General Meeting shall be held by 15 May, and each Club in the League shall be entitled to send one Representative for each two teams, or part thereof, entered in the League. The Meeting shall be called by Circular to each Club, together with Motions to be discussed, and fourteen days notice of the Meeting shall be given. At the Annual General Meeting each Representative shall have one Vote.
- 6. The Monies of the League will be deposited with the Bank of Scotland. All cheques must be signed by the Honorary Treasurer and countersigned by one of the undermentioned, namely, The President, or one nominated Committee Member. The specimen signatures to be lodged with the Bank annually by the 15 June.
- 7. Honoraria, the amount of which shall be determined the Annual General Meeting, shall be paid to such Officials as recommended at the Annual General Meeting.
- 8. A Special General Meeting of the League shall be convened on a

Resolution of the Committee, or within 14 days of receipt by the Secretary of a Resolution signed by the authorised representatives of at least one-third of the Clubs in membership of the League, and paragraph 5 of the Constitution and paragraph of the Constitution respecting circulation of Notices and Procedure shall apply as at the Annual General Meeting. Only "Business" detailed on the Agenda, which shall be circulated to all Clubs in League membership, may be discussed at a Special General Meeting. There shall be no 'Any other Business' item on the Agenda.

- 9. The Committee shall have powers to decide matters arising in connection with the League. The Committee shall have power to appoint representatives from each Division of the League to meet as necessary during the Playing Season to discuss the affairs of all Divisions.
- Seven shall form a Quorum of the League Committee, and the Chairman of the Meeting shall have a deliberate as well as a casting Vote.
- II. The Constitution and Rules shall only be capable of being altered, added to, or amended, on notice being given to the League Secretary of any proposed alteration, not later than the end of March, which notice shall give in detail any proposed alteration, addition, or amendment. A motion to alter, amend, or add to the to the Constitution and Rules must be carried at the Annual General Meeting by a majority of at least two-thirds of those present and Voting at the Meeting.

ELTTL Rules

- The games under the League shall be played according to the Rules of the Scottish Table Tennis Association. All Tables in the League must conform to the standard laid down by the STTA regarding size of table and the required bounce of the ball on the playing surface. The size being 274cm(9ft) length by 152.5cm (5ft) width. The upper Surface being 76cm(2ft6in) above the floor, yielding a uniform bounce of not less than than 22cm(8.3in) and not more than 25cm (9.75in) when a standard ball is dropped from the height of 30.5cm(12in). An approved 40mm ball, as approved by the ITTF, will be used in all matches. Where the rubbers are different, the racket shall be black on one rubber and red on the other. Players may only use racket blades currently approved by the ITTF. The covering on a side of the blade used for striking the ball shall be of a brand and type currently authorised by the ITTF and shall be attached to the blade so that the trademark and the ITTF logo are clearly visible near the edge of the striking surface. Covering may be attached to the racket blades only by the means of pressure sensitive adhesive sheets or ITTF authorised adhesives. This affects all divisions.
- The league shall be open to such clubs in Edinburgh and the Lothians as the Committee may decide. A club may enter more than one team in the league, but each team so entered must pay in advance an annual subscription to be determined at the Annual General Meeting of the league, plus such sums as are payable to the STTA.
- 3. All players must be registered members of the club for which they play. All players must be registered with the STTA at least 24 hours before playing in any match. Should any team play a non-registered player then all games won by that team, in the match in question, shall be void, and will be awarded to the opposing team.

A player may transfer clubs during the playing season as long as his/her previous club confirms acceptance in writing to the league secretary at least 24 hours before playing for their new club. The Match Secretary should agree the relative playing strength of the registering player.

- 4. No team shall play in any match until all fees are paid. Any team failing to comply with this rule shall forfeit all matches from the start of their season until all Fees are paid.
- 5. Except with the permission of the league committee, no player shall play in more than one league in the same season.
- 6. Any club entering more than one team in the League should register their 3 strongest players in the first team, their next 3 strongest in the second team, and

so on in order of playing strength for all teams. The committee shall have the power to refuse the registration of any player where his/her playing strength warrants his / her playing for a higher team. No player shall be allowed to play for a lower team than the one he/she is registered for.

Any new player, whose strength is unknown to the selection committee will only be allowed to play for the team he/she has been initially registered with. Once the player's strength has been confirmed by the club to the Match Secretary he/she can be fully registered in the correct team.

Any player having played a total of 6 matches with a higher team or teams in league matches other than the one he/she is registered for, he/she shall then only be eligible to play for the highest team played for during these matches. If a player subsequently plays in a higher team than the one he/she became committed to, the player will automatically become registered for the higher team only. Any player joining a club after initial registrations have been submitted should be registered for the team most suitable to his/her playing strength.

Any club wishing to relegate a player or players to a lower team must apply to the committee to do so. Any club wishing to register or re-register a player in a lower team than his/her strength warrants shall apply to the committee, giving reasons for special recognition. If permission is granted, the said player will only be allowed to play for his / her re-registered team. Prior to the start of the Season the League must advise relevant clubs, in writing, of the names of players who are not permitted to play for a higher team. There is no need for clubs to apply to the committee for the re-registering of a player "up".

Such players will not be eligible to play in any re-arranged fixtures which had been postponed prior to his/her re-registration.

- When entries are made to the League a home night for each team will be specified. A fixture list based on this information will be compiled and included in the handbook. When a team changes its home night after the information has been printed in the handbook, the team secretary must notify it writing (or by telephone) all other teams in the division of the change and ensure that the change is confirmed by all relevant team secretaries. Failure to do so may result in the first named team forfeiting the match.
- (b) A copy of the handbook will be supplied to each player on registration a fee to cover will be charged.
- (c) All teams must start the season according to the handbook unless otherwise agreed by the committee.

8.

- (a) A match is played between two sides of three players each, and consists of ten games, best of 5 sets, each player playing every opponent plus one doubles game. Two points will be awarded for a win and one point will be awarded to each team for a draw. Prior to the commencement of each match the players of the home team shall be inserted in the match scorecard by the captain of the home team, and thereafter the names of the players of the away team shall be inserted by the captain of the away team. The order of play shall be printed on the scorecard
- (b) All matches should start at the time stated in the handbook. Any player not ready to play within half-an-hour of the scheduled start time of the match may forfeit all games in the match.
- (c) No player may play for more than one team in the same evening.
- (d) The home club is responsible for posting the result on an addressed score-card, to reach the match secretary not later than seven days after the date of the match specified in the handbook. If the match secretary does not receive a result within the above period, (except in the event of a postponement being granted), (in terms of the immediately succeeding subparagraph), the home club will be fined, the amount to be fixed at the AGM. The fine for season 1999-2000 is 50p for a first offence, £1 for a second offence and the fine increase by 50p for each subsequent offence.
- (e) A team may not postpone a match except with the prior consent of the other team and the match secretary, such consents to be obtained **not later than three days prior** to the scheduled Date of the match. Failure to obtain the agreement of the match secretary will result in the offending club being fined (Fine fixed at the AGM = £2).

A team may not have more than two outstanding fixtures at any one time. Exception to this rule shall only be at the discretion of the match secretary.

In the event of the revised date not having been agreed upon, the match will be awarded against the team requesting the postponement. All complaints and disputes will be made to the match secretary. Any team penalised under this rule has a right to appeal to the committee.

9. Each club shall pay in advance a deposit of £10, returnable at the end of the season, provided the club has fulfilled all its fixtures to the satisfaction of the committee. A serious view will be taken of the non-appearance of a team when either insufficient or no notice has been given to their opponents, or when a match is conceded. Such offences shall be punished by fines, as under first offence = £5; second offence = £8; third offence =

£20 and a suspension of the team from the League for the remainder of the season. The committed players of the team which is suspended will also be suspended, the team will automatically be relegated to the bottom division for the following season, subject to an appeal to the committee.

10.


- (a) Any player playing under an assumed name will be suspended, along with his/her team members on that occasion, for a period not less than three playing months, and the player's club fined a minimum of £10.
- (b) Disciplinary action will be taken against any club and / or individual found guilty of ungentlemanly conduct.
- 11. A club having more than one team will require to replace their deposit of £10 within one month if the previous deposit has been lost. Failure to comply with this rule will lead to the club being suspended.
- 12. No player or club in membership of the League shall without consent of the committee participate in any match, exhibition or otherwise, which is under-taken by any person or persons for the purpose of financial gain. Likewise no player or club in membership of the league shall, without the consent of the committee, accept any payment for participating in any match, either by way of a fee or expenses.

13.

- (a) The Premier Division will consists of 6 teams and all other divisions of the League will consist of one section of no more than fourteen teams
- (b) At the end of each season promotion and relegation will be affected as follows:


Premier Division: bottom team will be relegated to the Ist Division Ist Division: top team will be promoted to the Premier Division. And the bottom two teams will be relegated to the 2nd Division. Other Divisions: top two teams will be promoted to a higher division and the bottom two teams relegated to a lower division. In the event of ties, individual matches will be considered. If a tie still results a play-off will be held in neutral premises.

(c) In the event of a team requesting to be relegated to a lower division, and such being approved by the League Committee, the team will be ineligible for the Division Title and/or promotion in the season so requested.

New Service Rule effective 1 September 2002, as approved at the ITTF's AGM on 5 April 2002 in Zagreb, Croatia:

2.6 A GOOD SERVICE

2.6.1 Service shall start with the ball resting freely on the open palm of the server's stationary free hand.

2.6.2 The server shall then project the ball near vertically upwards, without imparting spin, so that it rises at least 16cm after leaving the palm of the free hand and then falls without touching anything before being struck.

2.6.3 As the ball is falling the server shall strike it so that it touches first his court and then, after passing over or around the net assembly, touches directly the receiver's court; in doubles, the ball shall touch successively the right half court of server and receiver.

2.6.4 From the start of service until it is struck, the ball shall be above the level of the playing surface and behind the server's end line, and it shall not be hidden from the receiver by any part of the body or clothing of the server or his doubles partner.

2.6.5 It is the responsibility of the player to serve so that the umpire or the assistant umpire can see that he complies with the requirements for a good service.

2.6.5.1 If there is no Assistant Umpire, and the umpire is doubtful of the legality of a service he may, on the first occasion in a match, warn the server without awarding a point.

2.6.5.2 If subsequently in the match a service by that player or his doubles partner is of dubious legality, for the same reason or for any other reason, the receiver shall score a point.

2.6.5.3 Whenever there is a clear failure to comply with the requirements for a good service, no warning shall be given and the receiver shall score a point.

2.6.6. Exceptionally, the umpire may relax the requirements for a good service where he is satisfied that compliance is prevented by physical disability.



Explanation and intent of the new rule

The **intent** of the new service rule is to make the <u>rule</u> itself clear and easy to interpret. The new rule is designed to make the **Service** in table tennis an "OPEN" technique which is fully visible to the receiver at all times.

A detailed instructional and explanatory package will distributed by the ITTF's Umpires & Referees Committee to all International Umpires in order to guarantee consistent application of the rule and respect of the spirit of the rule.

In the meantime, the ITTF is distributing an explanatory package to the National Associations in which the new service rule is demonstrated in written and visual form.



In order for the server to ensure that he/she complies with the new service rule, here are a few pointers to help achieve this objective:

- 1. As soon as the free hand (the hand holding the ball in service) and arm has projected the ball upwards, the free hand/arm must be immediately removed to the side. In other words, the free arm must not remain in any area between the ball and the receiver- it has to be out of the line of sight of the receiver and the ball.
- 2. If the server could imagine a triangular space created by the ball and both net posts, then extends this space upwards to head level, the server must then ensure that no part of his body or clothing enters this space (or remains in this space) after he projects the ball upwards in service. This will ensure that the space between the ball and the receiver remains clear of any obstructions. This is a simple way to ensure that the service meets the legal requirements.
- 3. A slight modification from current services is required. Players must learn, in forehand services, to swing their free arm out of the way as fast as possible to create a legal, open and visible service.

Past Divisional Winners
